

Participants gather at 8:00 p.m. to hear *The Utah Old Time Fiddlers* sing and play their amazing music, as they celebrate America's Great Heritage.










The food lines provide orderly efficiency for the hungry participants!





- Revered Muhlenberg gives the benediction.






